Sewage treatment is a crucial process in wastewater treatment, aiming to eliminate impurities from sewage for safe discharge into the environment or reuse. It plays a vital role in preventing water pollution caused by untreated sewage. The wastewater treatment process involves primary, secondary, and tertiary treatment stages, with an additional quaternary

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treatment when necessary.

Sewage treatment plants have the primary objective of effectively treating wastewater to the best practical extent. While they can handle larger waste volumes than septic tanks, periodic emptying is still necessary. These plants treat 200 kiloliters per day of wastewater and utilize the treated sewage water for gardening purposes. The dried sludge resulting from the treatment process serves as fertilizer, contributing to sustainable waste management practices.

Water treatment, on the other hand, aims to enhance water quality for specific applications such as drinking water supply, industrial use, irrigation, river flow maintenance, and water recreation. The treated water is even packaged in bottles for supply during inter-college events. Key treatment units include sedimentation tanks, coagulation tanks, filtration units, and a disinfection unit, all working together to ensure effective water treatment and contaminant removal.

Bio-medical waste refers to waste generated during medical procedures, research, or the production of biological substances. This includes waste from surgeries on patients with infectious diseases. Proper management of bio-medical waste involves segregation and transportation through a designated Collection Point, handled by municipality staff. The Collection Point for bio-medical waste is conveniently located near the dental hospital.

Sewage treatment is a crucial process in wastewater treatment, aiming to eliminate impurities from sewage for safe discharge into the environment or reuse. It plays a vital role in preventing water pollution caused by untreated sewage. The wastewater treatment process involves primary, secondary, and tertiary treatment stages, with an additional quaternary treatment when necessary.

Sewage treatment plants have the primary objective of effectively treating wastewater to the best practical extent. While they can handle larger waste volumes than septic tanks, periodic emptying is still necessary. These plants treat 200 kiloliters per day of wastewater and utilize the treated sewage water for gardening purposes. The dried sludge resulting from the treatment process serves as fertilizer, contributing to sustainable waste management practices.

Water treatment, on the other hand, aims to enhance water quality for specific applications such as drinking water supply, industrial use, irrigation, river flow maintenance, and water recreation. The treated water is even packaged in bottles for supply during inter-college events. Key treatment units include sedimentation tanks, coagulation tanks, filtration units, and a disinfection unit, all working together to ensure effective water treatment and contaminant removal.

Bio-medical waste refers to waste generated during medical procedures, research, or the production of biological substances. This includes waste from surgeries on patients with infectious diseases. Proper management of bio-medical waste involves segregation and transportation through a designated Collection Point, handled by municipality staff. The Collection Point for bio-medical waste is conveniently located near the dental hospital.
